Of those 128 credits, at least 40 must be in upper-division courses (courses numbered 300 or higher). • Receive a grade of "C-" or higher in each core course. • Attain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher and meet any other grade requirements stipulated for your major. • Attain a grade of "C-" or higher in all upper-division courses required by your major. • Complete all major requirements specified by the department offering the degree. • ENGL 101 and 102 meet the university English Composition Requirement. • ANTH 102 meets the university Diversity Requirement. • MATH 124 meets the university Math Requirement.
